Cambridge Water Department Proactively Battling the Forever Chemical PFAS

Based on nothing more than their name, per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) certainly are not an ingredient you want to find in your sandwich wrap. But recent studies show, they're everywhere – in your pizza box, cosmetic bag, and maybe even in your clothing.

PFAS are widely used, long lasting chemicals, components of which break down very slowly over time. You may have even heard them being referred to as “forever chemicals.” Because of their widespread use and persistence in the environment, PFAS are now being found in water, air, fish, and soil across the nation and the globe.

The many thousands of PFAS chemicals found in

different products make it a challenge to study and assess its potential human health and environmental risks. Due to the long-term use of PFAS compounds, it's no surprise to find these forever chemicals in public drinking water systems across the country. Luckily for Cambridge residents, Massachusetts has some of the strictest regulations for drinking water in the country. In 2020, The Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection (MassDEP) promulgated a regulation for PFAS which went into effect on January 1, 2021. The regulation is a quarterly average of six specific PFAS compounds not to exceed 20 parts per trillion (ppt).

What is Cambridge Doing?

The Cambridge Water Department (CWD) began voluntarily sampling for PFAS in August 2019 and also initiated the development of a “PFAS reduction plan.” There is a seasonal variation in Cambridge’s PFAS concentrations, with the highest concentrations occurring in the late summer months and the lowest in the colder winter months. With support from MassDEP, a bench scale pilot study was developed to test the effectiveness of different filtering media to reduce PFAS concentrations. That study was completed by the end of 2021. Results determined that granular activated carbon (GAC) was the best method for CWD to significantly reduce Cambridge’s PFAS concentrations.

GAC has been shown to effectively remove PFAS from drinking water when it is used in a flow through filter mode after particulates have already been removed via pretreatment methods. The filters have always been part of Cambridge’s operating design. With PFAS center stage, and emerging health risks and stricter regulations on the horizon, CWD will make GAC replacement a preventative maintenance practice moving forward. Filter media changeouts are a recommended standard, especially now with PFAS in ground and surface waters across the country. Changing out the GAC filter media is not much different than changing out a Brita or home filter. After a certain amount of time or a certain volume, you change

the filter. The differences are that CWD’s filters are fixed in place and the filter media changeout is simply the exchange of the old carbon inside the filter with new carbon.

In spring 2022, CWD bid out and awarded the contract for the replacement of the filter media in its 6 filters. The project was scheduled to start this summer, but due to the COVID-19 pandemic and supply chain issues, the manufacturing, delivery, and installation processes were affected and severely delayed until the fall. When CWD’s initial August 2022 PFAS result came in over 20 ppt, which was subsequently rejected, the decision to switch to Massachusetts Water Resource Authority (MWRA) was made and carried out on August 30, 2022. CWD has remained in compliance with state and federal guidelines and subsequent regulation since PFAS was identified in Cambridge’s water in 2019. Work on this replacement project began in October. Once completed, CWD will start collecting samples to determine PFAS levels. We expect to see levels well below 10 ppt and possibly even “no detect” levels.

Once it is determined that PFAS levels are below 10 ppt (which is half the allowable safe limit) for the first two filters, CWD will begin blending Cambridge water with MWRA water. Gradually, Cambridge water flow will increase and MWRA will decrease until completion of all 6 filters, at which time, CWD should be fully operational and delivering the safest, highest quality water to your tap.

- Never let water run while doing dishes, brushing teeth, or washing hands.
- Look and listen to see if you have any water leaking, checking toilets often.
- Flush toilets only when needed.
- Run full loads of laundry.

the nation to implement procedural justice training in 2010, which focuses on improving community interactions through greater listening, transparency, care, and dignity. Recently, we were one of three cities participating in a national multi-site randomized research study that showed that these trainings resulted in reduced crime incidents and arrests, while improving community trust and relationships. Another example is Cambridge’s Safety Net Collaborative, a national model that has reduced juvenile arrests by 90% and supports youth through intervention and diversion strategies. And there are many more – including investments in trauma-informed care and our Police Cadet program. Commissioner Elow and her leadership team have a deep commitment to not just enforcing our laws, but working toward the overall health and wellness of our community. While there is still more work to be done, we are moving in the right direction and with the right values.

I have also been reflecting on how the City better engages our diverse community and the many voices that are trying to speak on important issues. The reality is that many people feel unheard, and there is a broader challenge over how we make decisions when the community disagrees. I hope that we can continue to look for common ground while moving forward and that we will also have healthy community conversations, reflecting our urgency and passion, but also our empathy for each other, respect for our good intentions, and the dignity of everyone in our City. For the City’s part, I recognize that there is work to do to improve our communication, transparency, and responsiveness and this is a priority for me.

As part of this, I’m excited to be more accessible and find time to sit with residents and get feedback. I am hosting regular meet-and-greets across the city. Cambridge Celebrates Opening of its Newest Creative Center, the Foundry

This fall, over 3,000 members of the Cambridge community gathered to celebrate the opening of The Foundry, the City's new self-sustaining center of creativity and collaboration in Kendall Square. The 50,000 square foot space offers opportunities in science, technology, engineering, arts, and math, as well as areas and programs for visual and performing arts, entrepreneurship, workforce education, and community activities. As a City-owned building, operated in partnership with Cambridge Redevelopment Authority, the Foundry will facilitate access for residents, especially underrepresented communities, to the dynamic working and learning environment of Kendall Square. The Foundry aims to keep programming and spaces financially accessible to community members through discounts based on income. Inside the Foundry, you can find Jukebox, a storytelling project created by artist Elisa H. Hamilton and commissioned by Cambridge Arts Council through the City of Cambridge Percent-for-Art Program. Cambridge Fuel Assistance Program Helps Low-Income Residents Pay for Winter Heating Bills

The Cambridge Fuel Assistance Program is accepting applications for the 2022-2023 season. The program, also known as the Home Energy Assistance Program, helps residents who meet federal income guidelines, pay their winter heating bills between November 1 and April 30. Over the past five years, the Fuel Assistance program has distributed more than \$4.8 million in heating bill assistance to Cambridge and Somerville residents.



"It is important to us that all Cambridge and Somerville households who qualify for this program get the support they need to save money and stay warm this winter," explains Claudia Cruz, Fuel Assistance Program Manager. "We have Spanish speakers on staff and can provide additional language support upon request. We can also accommodate in-person requests for appointments and make home visits to applicants who are homebound and need support completing their application."

The Fuel Assistance Program also helps clients access benefits offered through other agencies, such as gas and electric bill discounts, weatherization improvements like insulation and sealing, the state's Heating System Repair and Replacement Program, and more. Eligible applicants in no-heat situations or who are facing immediate utility shutoff can receive Fuel Assistance within 24 hours. Cambridge is First City in Massachusetts to Invest in Local Solar Using Contributions from its Community Aggregation Program

Cambridge is the first city in Massachusetts to invest in a local solar project using contributions from its electricity aggregation program. A 540-panel installation added to Graham & Parks School in September was paid for and is collectively owned by the 41,000 customers of Cambridge Community Electricity (CCE) aggregation program. The 243kW solar installation is expected to generate 280,000kWhrs of electricity annually. Over its lifetime, the solar installation's carbon-free electricity will reduce global warming emissions by over 4 million pounds, which is the equivalent of taking 426 cars off the road or planting over 32,000 trees.

The City is continuing to look for new ways to add more new renewable energy to the CCE program. Launched in 2017, CCE is a City-run program that provides Cambridge residents and businesses with an alternative to Eversource's Basic Service for electricity supply. Since launching, participants have saved over \$30 million on their electricity bills, while contributing to this local solar project. Winter is Coming. Are You Ready?

With the winter season upon us, we remind residents and property owners of their responsibilities per City Ordinance regarding snow and ice removal following a storm.

- * Clear sidewalks adjacent to your property 3-4 feet wide to bare pavement. This must occur within 12 hours after snow stops falling in the daytime, and before 1 p.m. when it has fallen overnight.
- * Clear corner properties on all sides and access to ramps at crosswalks.
- * Remove or melt all ice within 6 hours of the time it forms. If you are away, it is still your responsibility to ensure someone clears sidewalks and ramps next to your property. The fine for failing to comply with the City's sidewalk clearance ordinance is \$50 per day.
- * Use snow and ice melt products sparingly. When the snow melts, these products from roads, sidewalks, and driveways flow into the nearest catch basin and into our waterways. Try to buy products that are not toxic to animals and plants.



- * Help keep catch basins clear to prevent flooding.
- * Don't shovel snow into a bike lane.
- * Please help shovel out nearby fire hydrants.

Check Cambridge Snow Center for Updates

The City of Cambridge Snow Center, [Cambridgema.gov/snow](https://www.cambridgema.gov/snow), includes information and updates about snow emergency parking restrictions, alternative off-street parking, and closures.



What the City will do:

- * The City will chemically treat all major streets within three hours of when snow begins, keep them plowed during all stages of a storm, and work to clear all streets and sidewalks bordering City property once a storm has ended.
- * In certain instances, Public Works applies brine solution in liquid form to the roadway before anticipated snow or ice and prevents snow and ice from bonding with the street surfaces. Unlike granular salts which can bounce off roadways or get stuck on top of snow and ice, brine begins working immediately once it comes into contact with precipitation. This results in easier and more efficient snow removal. Additionally, using brine reduces the environmental impact by using approximately 30% less salt, and also cuts down on excess salt running off into tree wells and waterways.
- * We continuously evaluate processes to remove snow as efficiently and effectively as possible and invest in new equipment and environmentally friendly techniques to make the City's sidewalks and streets safe and passable for all users.

Prepare for Winter Storms

- * Make sure you have enough heating fuel to get through the storm;
- * Stock up on batteries, flashlights, canned goods, bottled water;
- * Ensure smoke and carbon monoxide detectors are working properly;
- * Make sure you have a supply of necessary medications.

No Heat?

To report no heat in your rental housing, contact Inspectional Services Department at 617-349-6100 and ask for the Housing Inspector for your neighborhood. After hours, call Cambridge Fire Department at 617-349-4900 to contact an inspector on your behalf.

Snow Exemption Program and Shoveling Assistance

Low-income residents who are elderly or have a disability may qualify for the City's Snow Exemption Program. For more information, call the Cambridge Council on Aging at 617-349-6220.

The Council on Aging can also provide a limited list of professional snow removal companies and students who will shovel for a fee to be negotiated.



Don't Forget these Important On-Street Parking Guidelines:

P

- * Park at least 20 feet from street corners to improve visibility and enable plows to push snow away from crosswalks.
- * It is illegal to use space savers to hold a cleared parking space; objects left in on-street parking spaces will be removed.

- * See sidewalks, bike lanes, or streets that need clearing? Reporting an issue only takes a minute and helps make our streets and sidewalks safer.

Cambridge Fire Department Brings Back In-House Fire Academy

In-house Training Helps Fill Vacancies More Quickly

In October, Cambridge Fire Department launched an intensive 11-week Cambridge Fire Academy, incorporating the principles of the Massachusetts State Fire Academy, but using its own certified fire instructors to enable more recruits to participate and to fill open positions 12 months sooner than normal.



Since 1980, Cambridge Fire Department has relied on the MA Fire Academy for new hires. This process takes 10 months and only allows six applicants per community.

Cambridge Fire Academy Recruit Class 2022-01 consists of daily fitness workouts followed by classroom and hands-on training. Twenty Cambridge Fire recruits have made it through an exhaustive background investigation process, passed medical exams, psychological exams, and Physical Ability Testing administered through the Commonwealth's Human Resource Division.

Upon graduation in January 2023, recruits will be Firefighter I/II certified; they will have successfully completed Hazardous Materials Operational Level training, water rescue, First Responder training, live burn experience, amongst other training vital to their success as Cambridge Firefighters.

A Win for Housing Affordability: City Council Adopts Changes to Incentive Zoning



The Cambridge City Council adopted an amendment to the Incentive Zoning Ordinance on October 17, 2022, which will increase funds for the City's Affordable Housing Trust. Under the new changes to the Incentive Zoning provisions of the City's Zoning Ordinance, the affordable housing

contribution rate will increase from \$21.02 to \$33.34 per square foot of gross floor area for new, large non-residential developments. Funds received under Incentive Zoning are used by the City's Affordable Housing Trust to fund the creation and preservation of affordable housing.

Last amended in March 2020, Incentive Zoning requires a Housing Contribution to offset the need for affordable housing that large non-residential development creates. Incentive Zoning housing contributions have provided more than \$20 million toward the development of affordable housing in the past 12 months.

This new amendment adds to the many tools Cambridge has put in place over the past few years to support affordable housing, including the 100% Affordable Housing Overlay, increases to the applicability of the Inclusionary Housing provisions of the Zoning Ordinance, and increases in City funding for affordable housing. In FY23, the City of Cambridge has allocated more than \$38 million of City funds toward the creation and preservation of affordable housing. The Affordable Housing Trust has commitments of more than \$100 million to affordable housing developments currently underway to preserve or create more than 500 affordable homes when completed.

Health Department Recommends COVID-19 Boosters and Flu Shots

The Cambridge Public Health Department encourages people to get vaccinated against COVID-19 and the flu.

The **COVID-19 vaccine** is recommended for everyone 6 months and older. People age 5 and older should receive boosters. A new bivalent booster became available this fall that offers protection against multiple COVID-19 variants. The bivalent booster is recommended for all adults and children age 5 and older. Getting all recommended doses of the COVID-19 vaccine gives you the highest level of protection.

The **flu vaccine** is also recommended for everyone age 6 months and older. Residents age 65 and older should ask for high-dose flu vaccine.

Both COVID-19 and flu vaccines are widely available at local pharmacies and many doctors' offices. To find COVID-19 vaccine locations, visit [Vaxfinder.mass.gov](https://www.vaxfinder.mass.gov). Call 988: Three Digits, One Connection for Individuals Experiencing Suicidal Crisis and Emotional Distress

In July 2022, a new, three-digit 988 number was implemented nationally for anyone in emotional distress or suicidal crisis.

Trained counselors, who are not clinicians, are available to provide free, confidential emotional support to all callers. It can also be used by an individual who is worried about a loved one and not sure how to support that person or where to get them help.

Calls to 988 are routed to the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline (now known as the 988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline). The previous Lifeline number 1-800-273-8255 (1-800-273-TALK) will always remain available to people in emotional distress or suicidal crisis.

What Happens When I Call 988?

- Calls will be routed to a call center based on a caller's area code.
- All calls will be answered by a highly trained staff or volunteer who will provide compassionate, non-judgmental support.
- Although the number is shorter, it will still connect to the same service which has been available in Massachusetts for many years.

What Happens When I Chat with the Lifeline?

- First, you'll see a wait-time message while we connect you to a crisis counselor.

- A counselor will answer your chat, listen to you, understand how your problem is affecting you, provide support, and share resources that may be helpful.

Renew Residential Parking Permits Online Starting December 1, 2022

2022 Resident and Visitor Parking Permits will expire on March 31, 2023. Beginning December 1, 2022, residents can renew their permit online. Online applications take three to five weeks to process. Please note that 2023 permits will not be mailed prior to January 3, 2023.

Beginning January 3, 2023, permits can be renewed in-person at the City's Traffic Parking and Transportation Department in the City Hall Annex at 344 Broadway, Cambridge.

From January 3 through March 31, 2023, cars parked in spaces with signs that say "Parking by Permit Only" may use either 2022 or 2023 parking permits.

Beginning April 1, 2023, cars parked in spaces with signs that say "Parking by Permit Only" must use 2023 Resident or Visitor Parking Permits.

Textiles & Mattresses Banned from Trash Disposal

As of November 1, 2022, all textiles and mattresses are banned from going into the trash in Massachusetts.

The City of Cambridge launched the Mattress Recycling Program in 2019 and a Clothing & Textiles Recycling Program in 2021. Textiles include all clothes, shoes, towels, sheets, and accessories. Items must be clean and dry, but even torn or stained textiles can be recycled or upcycled.

Both programs are free of charge, but items must be scheduled in advance for curbside pick-up.

Additionally, residents may drop-off textiles at nonprofits or at any of 12 drop-off sites sponsored by the City. To schedule a mattress or textiles pick-up, visit Cambridgema.gov/Recycle.



Building Connections with Separated Bike Lanes

The City of Cambridge aims to design our streets for people of all ages and abilities, whether they are walking, bicycling, driving, or taking transit. Our goal? To eliminate transportation-related deaths and serious injuries while increasing healthy, equitable mobility for all.

Building separated bike lanes is one way for us to meet that goal. Using a barrier or curb to physically separate people biking from vehicle traffic increases comfort and encourages more people to use this active, sustainable form of transportation. If people who want to can safely avoid car trips, Cambridge can reduce greenhouse gas emissions, improve our air quality, and reduce vehicle traffic.

But having separated bike lanes scattered randomly throughout the city doesn't get people where they want to go: that's why the City is building a network of separated lanes that connect people to important destinations around Cambridge. The City's Cycling Safety Ordinance requires that Cambridge install 25 miles of separated bike lanes by roughly 2026, and we're making progress on that goal. Since 2020, the City has installed approximately 8 miles of separated bike lanes.

Over the summer, the City installed quick-build separated lanes along Massachusetts Avenue near Porter Square. This fall, we installed quick-build lanes on Garden Street, a key east-to-west route connecting residents and visitors to retail, jobs, parks, and squares. The City is also in the midst of longer-term construction projects that will include separated lanes in Inman Square, River Street, and segments of Mass Ave known as the MassAve4.

These projects were designed with significant community input. Cycling Safety Ordinance projects generally include at least three community meetings, outreach to local businesses and other organizations, conversations with key stakeholders, and pop-up informational sessions that sometimes lead to the creation of community working groups.

What's coming next?

Quick-build separated bike lanes will come to part of Brattle Street (between Mason Street and Sparks Street) and the City is finalizing plans for Phase 2 of the project, between Sparks Street and Mt. Auburn Street.

The City of Cambridge is also starting design and engagement for upcoming quick-build projects on Hampshire Street, Main Street, and Aberdeen Avenue. Visit Cambridgema.gov/streetsandtransportation/projectsandprograms to learn more and sign up for mailing lists.

Tips for Controlling Rodents

Controlling rodents can be a difficult task for any community. Below are helpful tips you can try to reduce the impact of rodents (rats, mice, and squirrels) on our everyday lives:

- **Eliminate their source of food and water.** A rodent only needs one ounce of food waste per day to survive. Placing all food waste in locking compost carts is one of the best ways to combat rodents. The lock on compost carts seal in the odors so rodents have a much harder time locating and accessing food. Eliminate any standing water on your property.
- **Ensure your trash is properly managed.** Make sure all trash carts have their lids closed and make sure there are no food materials in the trash, especially in any excess trash bags placed at the curb on the morning of collection. If you have a trash, recycle, or compost cart with a chewed through hole in it, contact the Department of Public Works to request a replacement at: Cambridgema.gov/Recycle.
- **Apply for City's Private Property Rodent Control Program.** Residents in buildings with 4 units or less are encouraged to sign up for the City's Private Property Rodent Control Program. The Program provides free inspection and at least 3 baiting/trapping/follow-up inspections within a 60-day period. Learn more at Cambridgema.gov/Rodents.

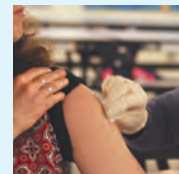

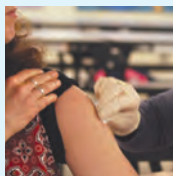

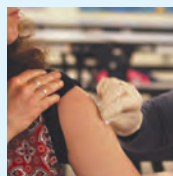
