Public Hearings: Landmark Designation Proceedings

Case L-140: 1627 Massachusetts Ave. Lesley University, owner. Consider confirmation of commission's initiation of a landmark designation study.

Public Hearing: Demolition Review and Landmark Designation Proceedings

Case D-1595 and Case L-141: 2161 Massachusetts Ave. ND Development, LLC, owner. Application to move building on lot and demolish rear and side sections. Consider petition by ten or more registered voters to initiate a landmark designation study.

Public Hearings: Demolition Review

Case D-1596: 47-53 Bay State Rd., by American Assoc. of Variable Star Observers, current owner, o/b/o Sun Property Group. Demolish house, offices, and warehouse buildings (1948 with later additions).

Case D-1597, D-1598, and D-1599: 4 and 6 Buckingham Pl. and 10 Buckingham St., by Buckingham, Brown & Nichols School. Demolish the Kelsey House (1894) and Morrison House (1884; moved 1893) and demolish the additions of and reconstruct the Markham building (1892 with later additions) on an adjusted site plan as part of the BB&N Lower School Revisioning.
