News from the Cambridge Animal Commission:

2018 Dog Licenses Valid 4-1-2018 to 3-31-2019

State law requires that all dogs over 6 months have a current dog license. The dog license period in Cambridge runs from April 1 of current year to March 31 of following year. Cambridge residents can apply for or renew their dog's license online or download the paper application and renew via mail or in person, following instructions on the respective form.

The fee for a dog license for a spayed/neutered dog is \$10, or \$30 for a dog that is not spayed or neutered. Dog licenses are renewed annually. The fine for an unlicensed dog is \$50.

In order to obtain a dog license, owners must have a current rabies vaccination. Dogs can be vaccinated at the veterinarian's office, at clinics held at some pet stores, or low cost clinics held periodically.
