There are plenty of green transit options: the bikeway, bus routes 72, 74, 75 & 78; and Alewife T Station is 1 mile away. On-leash dogs are welcome. Please note that rain cancels this event.

Saturday, May 11th is World Migratory Bird Day, a time to celebrate our little world travellers! Here at Fresh Pond we have over 15 Tree Swallow boxes installed and monitored. Tree Swallows (pictured right) not only give us wonderful views of aerial acrobatics and a flash of bright blue wings...

... each adult Tree Swallow can consume 850 mosquitoes per day!

## Pollinator Survey at Fresh Pond
