4. **East Cambridge Conservation District Study.** The 18th meeting of the Study Committee met virtually via Zoom on July 20. Cambridge Historical Commission staff gave an update on outreach in the neighborhood in June and July, which included four walking tours, three "office hours" sessions, and presentations to the East Cambridge Business Association and East Cambridge Planning Team.

Staff also shared the results of the postcard poll which was distributed to the public in early June. The two polls (one to all property owners in the study area and one to all active voters) were tallied separately.

All Owners: Support NCD Proposal: 89 (42%); Do Not Support: 112 (53%); Not Sure: 11 (5%)

All Active Voters: Support NCD Proposal: 161 (50%); Do Not Support: 135 (42%); Not Sure: 26 (8%)

Staff also tabulated respondents who own or reside in properties listed on the National Register (NR) of Historic Places:

1. *Building Old Cambridge*. Four thousand copies were printed; as of January 31, 2022, 2,186 had left the warehouse. This includes 70 in the current fiscal year, 65 in FY21, 129 in FY20, 55 in FY19, 303 in FY18, and 1,564 in FY17. Lifetime net receipts are \$57,936.
2. Oral history publications. We are considering reprinting *Crossroads: Stories of Central Square* (2001), and *Cambridge City Hall* (1990), which have gone out of print. A recent Council Order requested a report on the feasibility of reinstating an oral history program that would focus on the Black community (not feasible with present funding and staffing).
3. Out of print publications. The MIT Press has scanned and released *Report Two: Mid Cambridge* (1967), *Three: Cambridgeport* (1971), *Five: Northwest Cambridge* (1977), and *East Cambridge* (1988) as open-access PDFs.

1. Bronze maintenance. All municipal bronze plaques and statues are repatinated periodically. Weathering has been minimal, so we keep postponing from year to year.
2. Old Burying Ground. Recent research on African-American burials may indicate a section reserved for them. An assessment contract (the first in 20 years) has been awarded to longtime consultants Fannin-Lehrner Associates; a three-year conservation service contract is now being advertised.

 9. Cambridge Black History Project (aka Black Trailblazers, formerly African American Heritage Alliance; Leslie Brunetta, Melvin Downes, Chandra Harrington, Diahanne Lucas, Frank Lucas, Paula Paris, Kit Rawlins, Jim Spencer, Karen Ambush Thande)
 - Cambridge Black History Project: Production of series II of Black Trailblazers bookmarks stalled due to supply chain issues. Members of the project are working together to conduct oral history interviews with longtime Black residents; short excerpts from some interviews will become part of The Foundry's jukebox installation on local history. The Project will participate in Cambridge's Juneteenth celebration; specially designed flags will be placed on the graves of Black persons, both enslaved and free, who are buried in the Old Burying Ground

Allison Crosbie's submission on the former Harvard Botanic Garden at Linnaean and Garden streets won first prize in this year's national competition (following her second prize last year for her Larchwood streetscape report). **Allison submitted another essay on Lewisville last year, and this year just submitted one on the Grey Gardens subdivision of 1924.**
 12. The 19th Amendment commemoration project. The winning project proposal was "The Future to be Rewritten" by Azra Aksamija: <https://www.cambridgema.gov/Departments/citymanagersoffice/100years/nineteenthamentcentennialcommittee/azraaksamija>, but the designer selection was cancelled due to concerns about minority representation. This project will require a Certificate of Appropriateness for its proposed location on the Common. No developments.
 13. Cambridge Advisory Committee on City Art, Memorials and Markers (CACCAMM) (CS and SB). This committee reviewed public monuments, memorials, and markers throughout Cambridge "to determine whether any of these commemorate those who were linked to the slave trade or engaged in other similarly shameful acts, (and) to determine which individuals - particularly women, people of color, and those from other historically marginalized communities - should be newly recognized." CHC staff created a web page for the committee, managed meetings, and conducted an inventory of existing memorials and markers. The Final Report of the committee can be found on the CHC website.
 14. Mayor's Summer Youth Program (KR). In 2021 two students wrote short biographies of approximately 24 (of the 525+) people who are remembered on street corner dedication signs across the city. **See Archives and Collections for current projects.**
 15. CambridgeSide Open Space Advisory Committee meeting (AC). February 24. Allison Crosbie is representing the CHC on this committee, which was formed to advise the developers of the CambridgeSide mall on improvements to the Lechmere Canal Park. Discussing improvements with the successor firm to Carol Johnson Associates, the original designer.

16. Harvard Square Advisory Committee (AC). Allison Crosbie continues as CHC representative on the Harvard Square Advisory Committee.
17. Citizens Petition to Amend Ch. 2.78, Art. III. Heard by the Ordinance Committee on Sept. 29; no further action. Refiled and forwarded for committee review.
18. Winthrop Street Wall restoration. Secured an appropriation \$200,000 in CPA funds to support up to 50% of restoration cost (estimated at \$435,000), conditioned on a) a permanent, engineered restoration and b) donation of a preservation restriction allowing public access. Working out arrangements with shared property owners Raj Dhanda and Paul Overgaag.
19. **Inner Belt history. Volunteer Steve Kaiser has spent several years researching and writing about the history of the Inner Belt in Cambridge. The products of his work are featured on the CHC website.**
20. **Cambridge Indigenous History Project. Mayor Siddiqui has facilitated contacts with the local Indigenous community, but discussions about rewriting the history plaques at Winthrop Park are at a standstill for lack of community engagement.**
21. **Accessibility. Eric Hill is coordinating policy with Manager's Office and Disability Commission staff for producing documents and plans for visually impaired residents.**
22. **University Park history. Summer intern Henry Schmitt has been researching the history of the 1920s subdivision of University Park, a traditionally middle-class African American community in West Cambridge**
23. **Office move. In early 2023 the Commission staff will occupy new offices in the recently-purchased Cambridgeport Savings Bank building at 689 Mass. Ave.**

XV. Budgets, Personnel, and Facilities.

1. The proposed FY2023 CHC budget at \$864,180 is essentially level-funded from last year except for a cost-of-living increase. Meta Partenheimer's position as Digital Project Archivist permanent will be transferred from CPA to payroll in January 2023. Budget approved unanimously without comment.
2. **Appointments: Appointments and reappointments to all commissions were confirmed by the Council on April 25, but recruitment for vacancies has been suspended pending development of a policy to accompany the charter change adopted in 2021..**
3. Kit successfully added two interns to the CHC payroll and arranged stipend for a third. Successfully closed out FY2022 (7/1/2021-6/30/2022): deposited checks and an EFT payment from Mass Cultural Council FY2022 grant; and balanced all accounts, included CPA grant funds.
