4. East Cambridge Conservation District Study.

Staff is updating the Final Report in light of the amendments to Ch. 2.78 adopted by the City Council on October 2. At this time it appears that we will need to reconvene the Study Committee and hold another CHC hearing before forwarding the amended report to the City Council.

5. The City Council completed a multi-year discussion of amendments to the enabling ordinance for landmarks and NCDs, Ch. 2.78, Art. III.

Significant amendments affecting the Historical Commission include:

- NCD commissions no longer need a CHC representative, except in the first 3 years.
- Petition requirements raised to 30 for landmarks and 100 for NCDs
- Establishment of new NCD study committees subject to Council approval.
- CHC review of Affordable Housing Overlay or 100% affordable housing projects at landmarks or in Harvard Square CD to be advisory only.

Significant amendments affecting NCD commissions include:

- Amended purpose statement.
- Expanded NCD commission membership with new qualifications.
- Expanded NCD study committee membership with new qualifications.
- New petition requirements.
- New requirements for inclusion of public comments in the final report.
- Advisory review of ADA compliance, accessibility, climate resiliency, and renewable energy features
- No jurisdiction over Affordable Housing Overlay or 100% affordable projects
- Commissions may not consider the appropriateness of the size and shape of an addition of a new structure
- Commissions may not impose dimensional and setback requirements in addition to those required by the zoning ordinance
- Commissions must consider City Council goals in considering projects.
- Sunset review of new NCDs ten years after adoption.

VII. Publications

1. *Building Old Cambridge*. Four thousand copies were printed; as of January 31, 2022, 2,186 had left the warehouse. This includes 70 in the current fiscal year, 65 in FY21, 129 in FY20, 55 in FY19, 303 in FY18, and 1,564 in FY17. Lifetime net receipts are \$57,936.
2. Oral history publications. We are considering reprinting *Crossroads: Stories of Central Square* (2001), and *Cambridge City Hall* (1990), which have gone out of print. A recent Council Order requested a report on the feasibility of reinstating an oral history program that would focus on the Black community (not feasible with present funding and staffing).
3. Out of print publications. The MIT Press has scanned and released *Report Two: Mid Cambridge* (1967), *Three: Cambridgeport* (1971), *Five: Northwest Cambridge* (1977), and *East Cambridge* (1988) as open-access PDFs.

1. Bronze maintenance. All municipal bronze plaques and statues are repatinated periodically. Weathering has been minimal, so we keep postponing from year to year.
2. Old Burying Ground. Recent research on African-American burials may indicate a section reserved for them. Fannin-Lehner Preservation Consultants has been contracted to update a 2016 conditions assessment report of the Old Burying Ground. The contract has recently been extended through April 2024 and the survey is now underway. Only one firm bid on gravestone conservation due to onerous conditions required by public bidding laws, so the project has been divided and will be rebid.

- CPA-funded project to replace deteriorated African American markers on hold for lack of staff

8. Cambridge Women's History Project (Sarah Burks). Woman Suffrage research ongoing. Sarah continues to refine her Cambridge Women's Suffrage Timeline.

9. Cambridge Black History Project (aka Black Trailblazers, formerly African American Heritage Alliance; Leslie Brunetta, Melvin Downes, Chandra Harrington, Diahanne Lucas, Frank Lucas, Paula Paris, Kit Rawlins, Jim Spencer, Karen Ambush Thande)

- The committee invited Elizabeth Solomon to discuss early Indigenous history in Cambridge. Elizabeth, a member of the Massachusetts tribe, has been contracted by the Commission to

write text for new Winthrop Square history markers that will include the histories of Indigenous and African American peoples pre- and post-English settlement.

- **The project has received a \$20,000 grant from Mass Humanities for the oral history initiative; in addition to helping purchase recording equipment, the grant will fund public programs about the oral histories and an exhibit.**
 - **Members are finishing work on eight new Black Trailblazers biographical bookmarks: Dr. Mary Crutchfield Wright Thompson (pediatric dentist and community activist); Bill Hazelwood (award-winning TV producer/director); Ruth Easterling Taylor (lawyer; assistant city solicitor); Charles Lenox (early 18th century businessman); Dorothy Richardson (classically trained contralto and choral director); Takako Sato Salvi (first Black student at Cambridge Hospital's nursing school and family advocate); Emory Clark (proprietor of Emory's Pharmacy in North Cambridge); and Eddie Collymore (record-setting runner for Cambridge and Villanova; educator and mentor). Our graphic designer is laying out the images and texts, which will then go to the printer. The CBHP will unveil the new bookmarks in late January 2024 during a program at the main branch of the library.**
 - **The CBHP's website is being renovated, with new pages such as original research and program schedules; Trailblazer biographies will be edited and illustrated. Current site at cambridgeblackhistoryproject.org.**
10. Survey of Architectural History in Cambridge (Eric Hill). Misc. MHC Form B survey forms:
 11. Historic American Landscape Survey (HALS). This year Allison Crosbie won second place in a national competition for her submission of the Gray Gardens subdivision designed by the Olmsted Brothers firm in 1924. Previous submissions include Lewisville in 2021, the former Harvard Botanic Garden at Linnaean and Garden streets in 2020 (first place), and Larchwood streetscape in 2019 (second place).
 12. The 19th Amendment commemoration project. The winning project proposal was "The Future to be Rewritten" by Azra Aksamija: <https://www.cambridgema.gov/Departments/citymanagersoffice/100years/nineteenthamentcentennialcommittee/azraaksamija>, but the designer selection was cancelled due to concerns about minority representation. No developments.
 13. Cambridge Advisory Committee on City Art, Memorials and Markers (CACCAMM) (CS and SB). This committee reviewed public monuments, memorials, and markers throughout Cambridge "to determine whether any of these commemorate those who were linked to the slave trade or engaged in other similarly shameful acts, (and) to determine which individuals - particularly women, people of color, and those from other historically marginalized communities - should be newly recognized." CHC staff created a web page for the committee, managed meetings, and conducted an inventory of existing memorials and markers. The Final Report of the committee can be found on the CHC website. No developments.
 14. Mayor's Summer Youth Program (KR).
 15. CambridgeSide Open Space Advisory Committee meeting (AC). Allison Crosbie is representing the CHC on this committee, which was formed to advise the developers of the CambridgeSide mall on improvements to the Lechmere Canal Park. Planning Board Review raised additional concerns, restarting design review; still not landmark eligible IMO.
 16. Harvard Square Advisory Committee (AC). Allison Crosbie continues as CHC representative. On August 16 the committee reviewed special permit applications for Dunkin Donuts shops at 65 JFK Street and 61 Church Street due to change in ownership and continued discussion of potential pedestrianization of Harvard Square.
 17. **Citizens Petition to Amend Ch. 2.78, Art. III. See above for description of amendments.**
 18. Winthrop Street wall restoration. Secured an appropriation \$200,000 in FY22 CPA funds to sup-

port up to 50% of restoration cost (estimated at \$435,000), conditioned on a) a permanent, engineered restoration and b) donation of a preservation restriction allowing public access. Property owner Raj Dhanda's attorney, Charles LeRay, who stated at the November 3, 2022 Commission meeting that his client wished to resume negotiations, has not responded to outreach efforts. Mr. Dhanda acknowledged receiving the staff offer but did not wish to respond. **On August 30, 2023 Mr. LeRay reached out to discuss the status of the grant, which in the absence of progress was scheduled to be considered for cancellation. No developments.**

19. Inner Belt history. Volunteer Steve Kaiser has spent several years researching and writing about the history of the Inner Belt in Cambridge. The products of his work are featured on the CHC website.
20. Cambridge Indigenous History Project. Cambridge Indigenous History Project. Mayor Siddiqui has facilitated contacts with the local Indigenous community, but discussions about rewriting the history plaques at Winthrop Park were at a standstill all summer for lack of community engagement. Meanwhile a participatory Budgeting project allocated \$180,000 to commemorate Indigenous place names and other features of the landscape. We are developing relationships and forming a committee of Indigenous residents, historians, advocates, and language experts to steer the Participatory Budgeting project forward and to draft text for a new historic marker. We are meeting monthly and hope this group will become a long term advisory committee like the Cambridge Black History Project. Indigenous historian Elizabeth Solomon has joined the committee.
21. University Park history. In 2022 summer intern Henry Schmitt researched the history of the 1920s subdivision of University Park, a traditionally middle-class African American community in West Cambridge. We hope to create at least a blog post on this topic.
22. **Revolution 250 (Kit). Met with Gavin Kleespies, chair of Cambridge's Rev 250 events, Beth Folsom from History Cambridge, and Alyssa Pacy in the Cambridge Room, to begin talking about programs to highlight Cambridge's role in the revolution and post-war remembrances.**
