CAMBRIDGE, MA, April 4—The Cambridge Public Library will mark National Poetry Month with poetry readings, a submit-a-thon, and a youth poetry contest. Every April, National Poetry Month celebrates poets, their craft, and poetry's impact on our culture. The Library will host the following events during National Poetry Month:

Voices of Poetry: Four Poets, <u>Saturday, April 13</u>, 2-4 p.m., Main Library. Doug Anderson, January Gill O'Neil, Shanta Lee, and Lloyd Schwartz will each give a poetry reading, accompanied by the music of singer-songwriter Gabriella Simpkins. This event is in person. Registration is not required.

CPL Presents: A Showcase of Local Poets, <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>April 16</u>, 7-8:30 p.m., Main Library. Local poets Sam Cha, Imani Davis, Shangyang Fang, Julia Story and Raisa Tolchinsky will each read original work for fifteen to twenty minutes. This event is hybrid, and <u>registration is required</u>.

Submit-a-Thon, Monday, April 29, 6-8 p.m., Main Library. Writer and editor Meagan Masterman will lead an evening of submitting poems, stories, and other writing to small presses, literary journals and magazines in a supportive environment. This event is in person, and <u>registration is required</u>.
