BOARD OF ELECTION COMMISSIONERS MEETING Minutes of April 7, 2021

The Chair called the meeting to order at 5:30 pm on April 7, 2021 via Zoom.

The Chair took up Item number two under Old Business in the Action Agenda - review of the "Rules of the Board of Election Commissioners," so that the group could discuss matters with Arthur Goldberg of the City Solicitor's Office.

Mr. Goldberg introduced himself, and stated that he was present to answer any questions regarding the draft rules under consideration by the Commission.

The Commissioners asked questions regarding the rules contained in the draft document and the necessity of some to be included. Mr. Goldberg explained that the rules provided details about conduct at the meeting to inform anyone attending as to appropriate behavior. The group also discussed with Mr. Goldberg regarding the possibility of the public being allowed to attend meetings via Zoom after restrictions have been lifted post-pandemic. Mr. Goldberg stated that this provision is being considered but does not have any updates at the moment.

There was also discussion regarding the provision of name and address by members of the public speaking at a meeting, and considerations being made for individuals who may have issues of safety where disclosure of certain information would be difficult. Mr. Goldberg stated that the Commission has the discretion to suspend the rules as necessary. Mr. Goldberg also informed the Commission that the only rules that could not be suspended were provisions required by law: for example, a quorum is necessary to hold a meeting.
