

#### **CAMBRIDGE HISTORICAL COMMISSION EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**


This summary outlines the existing conditions and proposed renovations of the Waugh Building located at 30 JFK Street, Cambridge MA.

The subject building located at 30 JFK St is a four story, wood framed, un-sprinklered, brick veneered building that was originally constructed in 1936 and then had floors and renovations added in 1952, 1962 and finally in 1964 when the fourth floor was added. For the last few decades, the building's envelope has remained relatively unchanged except for a first-floor storefront remodeling to accommodate Shawmut Bank in the early 1980's. The structure occupies the entire footprint of the site, is bound in on all four sides and has a total building area of approximately 17,700 square feet.


Presently the owners of the building are preparing to upgrade all code deficiencies as well as update the JKF St. façade and have engaged CambridgeSeven to provide these design services. The scope of work includes providing a fully sprinklered building, upgraded MEP systems and corrective work associated with paths of travel, stairways and means of egress.


From reviewing archived plans and documents, the basic design of the building reflects a mid-century modern aesthetic. The brick work is simplified, and lacks articulation and the windows are classic ribbon windows reflecting the International Style that was so popular at the time. The first-floor retail facade is straightforward with what appears to be a black granite panel system for the signage band and an anodized aluminum storefront.


The planned façade improvements include the removal of the bulkhead used for basement egress, reconfiguring the storefront entrances, and accommodating new fire department connections. The wrought iron fire escapes will be removed, the brick facade repaired, and the installation of new anodized aluminum frame windows and a dark granite storefront surround will bring the façade back to being simple and elegant as it was originally in 1964. The existing signs posted-off the façade and the rotating clock will remain. The "30 Waugh Building" sign in Avenir typeface will be reinstated.




# THE WAUGH BUILDING 30 JFK STREET RENOVATIONS




