












We learn through challenge









Hult House Residence Hall

Strategic & Long-Term Planning


- Expansion of Cambridge campus academic offerings:

Sustainability & Resiliency Planning

- Properties incorporate energy efficiency and environmental sustainability components
- Hult House (opened 2019) designed to LEED v4 Gold standard
- Bike parking brought online in conjunction with Hult House opening – 340 long-term and 80 short-term spaces
- EF initiative to achieve carbon neutrality by 2031
- Hult initiative to reach NetZero carbon emissions for Scopes 1 and 2 by 2030 and Scope 3 by 2050

- Collaborated with Cambridge public & charter high schools to recruit for the Hult Scholar Grant program (launched 2019-20)








Community Engagement Goals


