

## **Broadway Safety Improvement Project**

Separated Bike Lanes and Other Safety Improvements from Quincy St. to Portland St.

### **Street Layout Changes**

The City of Cambridge will add separated bike lanes and make related safety improvements on Broadway. We will:

### **Install separated bike lanes:**

This refers to bike lanes along the curb, separated from vehicles by white flex-posts or other physical barriers.

### Add traffic calming:

Changes for people walking and taking the bus: Bus stop locations may change, and pedestrian safety enhancements will improve crosswalks.

### Reduce parking:

This project will reduce on-street parking. We haven't finished design, but we hope to maintain about 40% of the current spaces with parking on one side of the street

# **Broadway Safety Improvement Project**

The City of Cambridge plans to add separated bike lanes and make related safety improvements on Broadway. What do we know about the project so far?

### What Will Change?

Improved safety for all users, separated bike lanes, and reduced parking along the corridor

#### **Proposed Street Layout**

With one-side street parking and one way bike lanes on each side.

### **Project Area Map**

The project area is between Quincy St to Portland St on Broadway.

### **Reduced On-Street Parking**

This project will reduce on-street parking. We haven't finished design, but we hope to maintain about 40% of the current spaces.

### Separated Bike Lanes

We will move bike lanes against the curb and separate them from moving vehicles with white flex posts.
