Standard Demographic Battery for Cambridge Surveys

This document has survey questions that can be used in any survey to gather basic demographic information about respondents.

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General Guidance

- Unless otherwise noted, these questions should appear at the end of your survey.
- You should **preface the demographic questions with this statement:** "The following questions are optional. Answering them will help the City to determine whether the survey respondents are a representative sample of the Cambridge population."
- You should provide information (like a web page link) on how people can view the results of the survey once it is complete.
- If you are using survey software such as SurveyMonkey that allows you to **anonymize the responses** (meaning you will not see the IP address of respondents), you should select that option, and include language like this at the beginning of the survey:

"Your responses to this survey are anonymous. No personally identifiable information is captured unless you voluntarily include personal or contact information in your responses. Your IP address may be recorded by SurveyMonkey but is not stored with or linked to the survey results made available to the City of Cambridge."



Major languages and language groups other than English reported by the 2014 - 2018 American Community Survey Public Use Microdata Sample include Spanish (7.1%), Chinese (5.1%), Indic Languages (3.6%),



French, including Haitian Kreyol, (3.2%), African Languages (2.2%), Korean (1.3%), Portuguese (1.2%), and German (1.2%).

The Cambridge Public School Department reports that for the 2019 - 2020 school year over 100 students speak the following foreign languages at home: Spanish (5.7%), Amharic (2.6%), Bengali (2.3%), Haitian Kreyol (2.2%), Arabic (1.9%), and Chinese (1.9%).
