Part I Total Crime

An analysis of the serious crime statistics for the first eight months of 2024 points to a 3% increase in the Part One index total for Cambridge when compared with the same time frame in 2023. Through September 2nd of 2024, there were 2,222 serious crimes reported in the City. For the same time period in 2023, the combined total for Murder, Rape, Robbery, Aggravated Assault, Burglary, Larceny & Auto theft was 2,160 incidents, 62 fewer than 2024. A 20% rise in the crime index has also been registered when measured against the five-year weighted average.

Further analysis of the crime totals for the first eight months of 2024 indicates that violent crimes recorded a 16% decrease when compared to last year. There were zero homicides, 27 rapes, 66 robberies, and 196 aggravated assaults recorded through September 2nd of this year.

Conversely, the numbers indicate that property crimes saw a rise, increasing 6% above the 2023 total for the first eight months, with 117 more crimes reported in 2024. Despite a 77% rise in shoplifting incidents, a 3% increase in housebreaks, and a 1% rise in larcenies from residences, sizeable reductions in larceny from motor vehicles (-27%) and larceny of bicycles (-16%) were key to keeping the property crime increase relatively small.

When analyzing the serious crime totals of August 2024 versus the previous month of July 2024, there was an increase of 2% in the number of index incidents, with five more crimes reported in August.

Part I Property Crime

Analysis of property crime totals for the first eight months of 2024 reveals a 6% increase when measured against the same time frame in 2023 and a 21% rise above the five-year average of 1,592.

More than half of the property crime categories are recording decreases when measured against the first eight months of 2023. Notable reductions in larceny from motor vehicles (-27%), larceny of bicycles (-16%), and auto thefts (-28%) were able to counter increases in housebreaks (+3%) and shopliftings (+77%), resulting in only a minimal increase when compared with the same time last year. It should be noted that shoplifting is by far the most prevalent crime type plaguing Cambridge this year. The increase of almost 275 shoplifting incidents thus far in 2024 when compared with 2023 is the major factor causing Cambridge to see an increase in overall crime this year, despite reductions in so many other crime types.

Part I Violent Crime

From January 1st to September 2nd of 2024, there were 289 violent crimes recorded in Cambridge, 55 incidents (-16%) below last year's total of 344 incidents for the first eight months of the year and 25 incidents (9%) above the 264 crimes forecasted through September 2nd.

There have been 27 rapes reported in Cambridge through August of 2024, which is down nine incidents from 2023. The 27 rapes reported thus far in 2024 have been categorized as six acquaintance assaults, nine contact rapes, seven blitz incidents, and five domestic assaults.

The trend observed during the past couple years of a high percentage of aggravated assaults and street robberies occurring in Central Square and on peripheral side streets began to reemerge in the spring, after a lull in activity in that area during the beginning of 2024. So far, eight months into the year, 68 (or 35%) of the 196 aggravated assaults and 27 (or 51%) of the 53 street robberies have been reported in the Central Square area.

The last homicide reported in Cambridge occurred shortly after midnight on November 23, 2023, in the area of 10 Magazine Street in Central Square. Two individuals with gunshot wounds were located and transported to a Boston hospital. One victim, 27-year-old Danasia Greene of Cambridge, was pronounced deceased at the hospital. The second victim, a 26-year-old male from Boston, was treated for non-life-threatening injuries. The incident remains under investigation at this time.

MURDER

No Patterns

- No murders have been reported in Cambridge in 2024 through September 2nd.
- Shortly after midnight on November 23, 2023, officers responded to the area of 10 Magazine Street in Central Square. Two individuals with gunshot wounds were located and transported to a Boston hospital. One victim, 27-year-old Danasia Greene of Cambridge, was pronounced deceased at the hospital. The second victim, a 26-year-old male from Boston, was treated for non-lifethreatening injuries. This incident marked the first homicide reported in Cambridge in over two years and was the only homicide reported in the City in 2023.* It remains under active investigation at this time.
- There were no murders recorded in Cambridge in all of 2022. This has happened only three other times in the past 20 years—in 2004, 2007, and 2010.
- In the last reported homicide in Cambridge prior to the November 2023 incident, on Saturday 3/27/21, there was a fatal shooting that occurred at approximately 12:40 a.m. on Pemberton Street. The victim was reportedly located unconscious outside his vehicle by a passerby who called 911. The victim was transported to Mount Auburn Hospital where he later died. The victim has been identified as Xavier Louis-Jacques, 19, of Cambridge. The investigation is ongoing.



RAPE

No Patterns

- There have been 27 rapes reported in Cambridge through the first eight months of 2024. This is down nine incidents (-25%) from the 36 rapes reported during the same time frame in 2023.
- The 27 rapes reported thus far in 2024 have been categorized as six acquaintance assaults, nine contact rapes, seven blitz incidents, and five domestic assaults.
- On Friday, May 17, 2024, at approximately 9:18pm, police responded to the Cambridgepark Drive area for an assault in progress. The victim told officers the assailant was a masked man with a knife. Detectives processed a crime scene in a restroom of a commercial building and are working with Massachusetts State Police and the Middlesex District Attorney's Office. The investigation is ongoing.
- The total number of reported rapes tends to fluctuate from year to year, but the number of stranger-to-stranger rapes reported each year in Cambridge—typically between one and ten remains extremely low.



AGGRAVATED ASSAULT

No Patterns

- The total of 196 aggravated assaults reported through September 2, 2024, is 8 crimes (-4%) below the first eight months of 2023, and 30 incidents (18%) above the fiveyear average of 166 crimes. August saw a decrease of 27% below July, with ten fewer incidents reported in the past four weeks.
- The 196 aggravated assaults reported so far in 2024 have been comprised of the following classifications: 48 domestic assaults; 47 unprovoked scenarios; 22 acquaintance assaults; 14 each of psychotic episodes and juvenile-related assaults; 12 traffic/parking related assaults; 10 between unhoused individuals; seven workplace incidents; six assaults on police; five each between shop owner/patrons and affray/brawls; four landlord/neighbor assaults; and two bar/alcohol-related incidents.
- The trend observed during the past couple years of a high percentage of aggravated assaults occurring in Central Sq and on peripheral side streets has begun to resurface over the last few months, but incidents are still generally spread across the city. Sixty-eight of the 196 aggravated assaults (or 35%) year-to-date were reported in Central Sq. Of the 68, 26 of those were of the unprovoked category which is more than double any other category in this area.
- There have been 11 confirmed shots fired incidents in Cambridge through September 2, 2024. Nine of the 11 resulted in no injuries, while the shootings on May 23rd and July 16th resulted in non-fatal injuries to three total victims. Through the same time period in 2023, there were five (5) confirmed shots fired incidents: three non-fatal shootings with four total victims and one shots fired incident with no injuries.








Shootings & Shots Fired in Cambridge: 1.1.24 – 6.30.24 (First Half of 2024)

Robbery


No Patterns

 The five-year average for overall robbery in Cambridge for the first eight months of the year is 71 incidents. Through 9/2 of 2024, 66 robberies were recorded, which translates to a 7% drop below the projected total and a 37% decline below the 104 robberies counted for the first eight months of 2023.

- There have been 13 commercial robberies reported year-to-date in 2024. This total is down 14 incidents (-52%) from the 27 robberies reported through Sept 2 in 2023 and is down three incidents (-19%) from the five-year average of 16. All 13 robberies reported year-todate have been unrelated, but ten of the 13 did involve shoplifting incidents across the city that escalated into robberies.
- Street robberies year-to-date in 2024 are down 24 incidents (-31%) from the 77 reported through this time in 2023 and are down two incidents (-4%) below the five-year average of 55. Eight incidents citywide so far in 2024 have resulted in an arrest, and suspects have been identified in at least 15 others.
- There have been no active street robbery patterns reported in Cambridge thus far in 2024, but multiple incidents in the Central Square area have involved unhoused individuals as victims and/or suspects. There have also been a few reports of robberies involving juvenile suspects in recent months, but it is unknown if any are related at this time.
- After seeing a relatively quiet start to the year in Central Square, robbery activity began to pick up in this area in March. Eighteen of the 34 street robberies reported since May 1 have taken place in Central Square, bringing the total reported in and around the Square this year to 27, which is 51% of the 53 street robberies reported citywide. This is similar to a trend seen in this area that began in 2021 and continued throughout all of 2022 and much of 2023. However, it's important to note that only one of the five robberies reported in the past month took place in Central Square. It is unknown if this is just a temporary decline or a downward trend.



Geographic Breakdown of Street Robberies: 1.1.24 – 9.2.24



Burglary

No Pattern

 The property index crime of burglary, the combination of residential and commercial breaks, has recorded an increase of 1% through September 2nd of 2024 when compared to the 173 reported through the same time in 2023. The total of 174 incidents reported year-to-date is also up 16% when compared with the five-year average of 150.

- Housebreaks, while up 3% in 2024, have only risen by four incidents from 124 breaks during the first eight months of 2023 to 128 this year. Activity, which spiked in January with 27, dropped off the next four months, spiked again in June with 23 incidents and saw a decrease in July and August with 14 and 16, respectively.
- Of the 16 incidents that occurred in August, nine occurred in the upper half of the city with West Cambridge reporting three incidents.
- Conversely, commercial breaks are down by three incidents (-6%) this year, dropping from 49 incidents through the first eight months of 2023 to 46 year-to-date in 2024. There were two related commercial breaks overnight from 1/24-1/25 in North Cambridge, where two females broke into a Dunkin Donuts and an office. One of the parties was arrested in Boston and has been connected to other regional breaks. There were also two related commercial breaks that occurred overnight from 4/11-4/12 in two neighboring businesses in East Cambridge.
- There was a sporadic series of commercial breaks targeting copper at construction sites in North Cambridge earlier this year. One street in this neighborhood experienced four breaks between January and May, with the most recent two occurring at the end of May. Two parties have possibly been identified in connection with the two May breaks. It is unknown if the previous incidents are related.








Geographic Breakdown of Housebreaks: 1.1.24 – 9.2.24

LARCENY

No Patterns

total of 1,688 larcenies reported in 2024 is also 25% above the 5-

year average of 1,351 incidents.

- Preliminary stats indicate that overall larceny year-to-date in 2024
- The larceny from motor vehicle total through September 2nd in 2024 is 180 incidents, 27% below the same time frame in 2023. The decrease in 2024 compared to last year can be partly attributed to a drop in catalytic converter thefts. Through September in 2023, there had been 21 catalytic converter thefts reported, while so far in 2024, there have been none.
- Through September 2nd, 2024, there were 59 larcenies from the person reported in Cambridge, down 14% (10 incidents) when compared to the same time period in 2023. Central Square has had the largest number of thefts with 26 incidents so far this year.
- There have been 141 larcenies from buildings reported through September 2nd, 2024. This total is four incidents (3%) less than the same time period last year and 13 incidents (10%) more than the five-year average. There are no defined patterns of this crime type in the city at this time.
- Larcenies from residences are up two incidents (1%) in 2024 when compared with 2023. Package thefts have made up the majority of this crime type in recent years and registered even higher than average in 2020-2022 due to the increased volume of deliveries during the pandemic. Package thefts have accounted for 176 (or 66%) of the 267 larcenies from residences thus far in 2024.
- There have been 314 larcenies of bicycles reported through September 2nd in 2024. This total is 58 incidents (16%) below the total through the same time period in 2023 and 29 incidents (8%) below the five-year average of 343. The top neighborhoods for bike thefts so far this year have been The Port with 53 followed by North Cambridge with 39.




LARCENY From MV

No Patterns

- The larceny from motor vehicle total for the first eight months of 2024 is 180 incidents, which is 27% (66 incidents) below the total for the same time period in 2023. The 180 thefts from cars reported through September 2nd also indicates a decrease of 82 incidents (-31%) below the 262 car breaks forecasted for the first eight months of the year.
- The neighborhoods with the highest larceny from motor vehicle totals through August of 2024 are: Inman/Harrington (30), Cambridgeport (27), and The Port (24).
- Comparing the last four weeks (August) to the previous four (July), there was a 39% decrease in larcenies from motor vehicles, with twelve fewer incidents reported.
- Of the 180 incidents reported thus far in 2024, 84
 vehicles (47%) were entered via unknown means and
 73 vehicles (41%) were left unlocked at the time of the
 theft.
- A Somerville man was arrested on 4/8 and is believed to be responsible for numerous larcenies from motor vehicles in the Mid-Cambridge area. The same Somerville man was arrested on 5/30 in Somerville and once again is believed to be responsible for a number of car breaks in the Cambridgeport area around the time of his arrest.



LARCENY from Person No Patterns

- Larcenies from the person through September 2nd, 2024, declined by 10 incidents (14%) compared to the same time period in 2023 and was 13 incidents (18%) below the five-year average of 72 incidents. Ten thefts were reported in the past four weeks (August), which was three more than the previous four weeks (July).
- Twenty-six of the 59 incidents year-to-date in 2024 took place in Central Square. The other incidents took place throughout the city, with Harvard Square registering 12 incidents, followed by Porter Square with five, East Cambridge, Inman Square, 1500-1900 Mass Ave, and Bay Square with three each, two for Kendall/MIT, and one each for Cambridgeport/Riverside and Alewife/ West Cambridge.
- In recent years, higher numbers in Central Square have mainly been due to grab-and-run situations. However, only seven incidents of this nature have taken place in Central Square year-to-date. Another common situation involves individuals who are unhoused whose property may have been stolen while they were asleep or otherwise distracted; this has accounted for nine incidents in this area so far this year. Pocket-picking thefts have also accounted for five incidents in Central Square this year.



LARCENY of Bicycle No Patterns


- There have been 314 bicycle thefts reported citywide in the first eight months of 2024, down 16% from the 372 reported during the same time period in 2023. Additionally, the 2024 total year-to-date is registering at 8% below the five-year average of 343.
- The most recent four weeks (August) saw a 4% increase in bike thefts when compared with the previous four weeks (July), with two more thefts reported. This is an expected trend as warmer weather typically leads to increased ridership and more opportunities for theft. However, bike theft numbers are still registering lower than expected for the summer months this year.
- Of the 314 bike thefts reported in 2024, 241 (77%) were reportedly locked at the time of the theft.




Geographic Breakdown of Bicycle Thefts: 1.1.24 – 9.2.24

Geographic Breakdown of Package Thefts: 1.1.24 – 9.2.24




AUTO THEFT

No Patterns

- The five-year weighted average for auto thefts through the first eight months of the year is 92, and with 71 reported so far in 2024, Cambridge has experienced a decrease of 23% below the expected total. Auto thefts are also down 28% (28 incidents) when compared to the first eight months of 2023.
- When comparing the most recent four weeks (August) to the previous four weeks (July), auto thefts have decreased by two incidents (33%).
- The neighborhood breakdown for auto theft totals so far in 2024 is as follows: The Port 13; Cambridgeport 12; Peabody 9; North Cambridge 9; East Cambridge 8; Mid-Cambridge 6; Riverside 5; West Cambridge 4; Strawberry Hill 2; Inman/Harrington 2; Agassiz 1.
- As to be expected during the warmer weather, there
 has been an increase in the thefts of two-wheeled
 vehicles over the past few of months.
- There have been a few thefts reported so far in 2024 where the operator left the vehicle unlocked and often running in order to deliver a package or grab food. When the victim returned, the vehicle was gone.
- Twenty-five of the 71 motor vehicles stolen in 2024 have been recovered to date.


