Let's Go Bugging! Pollinator Survey Workshop

Do you enjoy the wildflowers of urban parks or your own garden? Ever wonder which types of pollinators also enjoy them? Join participatory scientists from Earthwise Aware (EwA) at the Lusitania Meadow to learn how you can help document arthropod activity around Fresh Pond and in your neighborhood.

What to Expect: Spend part of your afternoon with us in the meadow, learning how to identify arthropods and their host plants.
