Agassiz Baldwin: Outback

Location: 20 Sacramento Street Cambridge, MA

Dates/Times: 8 one-week sessions from July 11 - September 2; Monday-Friday, 8:30AM-3PM (regular day); 8:30AM-5:45PM (extended day)

Primary Program Activities: Arts (ceramics, painting, mixed media, printmaking), sports & games, dance/drama. Choice-based program with a variety of activities.

Grades/Ages Served: Rising JK through rising 6th grade

To Enroll: Enroll through the online [registration system](#) when registration opens (date March 1). It's recommended to set up an account beforehand to make sure you're ready the day of. You will then pay a deposit (\$100 per week that you sign up for) and complete a permissions form. Screen reader support enabled.

Deadline: No deadline - enrollment is open until the program fills up. Typically we see a waitlist start on the day enrollment opens, but there can be some movement.

Cost: \$412 per week for regular day, \$567 per week for extended day. There is a discount if you pay by check or automatic withdrawal, and those rates are \$400 for regular day and \$550 for extended; Scholarships, Vouchers available
